Geography	In this topic we will use map to identify the UK and it's countries, including the capital cities. We will develop observational skills when we look closely at our local area. We will identify key physical and human features of our local area and we will construct simple maps and use a basic key. When talking about the key human features of our local area we will use the		
	vocabulary city, town, village, factory, farm, house, office.		
Design Tech- nology	In this topic we will look at the features of a local playground. We will explore different types of playground equipment, how they move and what they are made of, as well as exploring different ways of joining materials together. (Materials and construction)		
Art and Design	In art this term we will look at using our observational skills to draw pictures of our local area. (Drawing and painting)		
PE	In PE this term we will develop a range of multi skills.		
Computing	This term in computing we will learn to communicate using power point. We will learn how to use specific features and will produce a simple presentation about our local area.		
PSHE	Healthy Living This half-term we will focus on being healthy and how this is achieved. We will explore health in the physical sense and consider reasons why some children aren't healthy. We will begin to consider the 'Rights Respecting School' campaign ensuring that children understand why it was introduced and why it is important. Children will start to make links to themselves, local community and wider world. Children will understand who the rights apply to and their best interests should always be at the heart of decision making.

Year 2 (Autumn 1)		
Literacy	In Literacy we will be following the Language and Literacy Scheme of work. The focus here will be on reading and writing fiction etxts. Reading and writing explanations and non chronological reports. In grammar we will look at capital letters, question marks, suffixes, commas in lists and compound words.	
Numeracy	In Maths we will use the knowledge of our number bonds to derive facts up to 100. We will learn about the place value of each digit in a 2 digit number and will compare and order numbers to 100. We will write mathematical statements using add, subtract, divide and multiply. We will learn that addition can be done in any order and begin to understand the commutative law in multiplication. We will investigate length and mass and use standard units to measure these.	
Science	This term in Science we will undertake a study of different materials and their properties. They will be collecting material and also creating new things from old material.	
History	Not covered this half term.	
Geography	As part of our study, we will locate the world's seven continents and five oceans. We will learn about the countries and cities of the United Kingdom and its surrounding seas and will compare the key human features of our home to different countries around the world.	
Design Tech- nology	This term we will explore different ways of making windmill bases, learning how to join materials together and make axles allowing sails to spin in the wind. We will then design, make and evaluate their own windmills! This will link in with our work about the world where we will look at the Netherlands and its windmills. (Construction and mechanics)	
Art and De- sign	This term we will look at the patterns, shapes and textures within different buildings around the world. We will explore textures by taking rubbings of different materials and use what we have discovered to create our own class mural using print. (Print)	
PE	In PE this term we will be learning about invasion games. We will be learning the skills of these games through the sport of football.	
Computing	This term in computing we will learn to communicate using Powerpoint. We will build on the skills we learnt in year one and use specific features to produce a presentation about a country we have studied.

	Year 3 (Autumn 1)
Literacy	In Literacy we will be following the language and literacy scheme of work. Here will learn how to develop settings witin a story and study playscripts. We will also learn to analysis and construct information and instruction texts. Ion grammar we will focus on adverbs and abverbials, and inverted commas. We will also read a range of fiction and non fiction texts related to the period of history we are studying. In Maths this half term we will look at place value in numbers to 1000 and learn to count in steps of 50 and 100. We will also look at addition and subtraction and will learn to use formal methods to add and subtract
Science	numbers with three digits. We will also solve a range of number problems using these skills. In this topic we will investigate metals and magnets. We will find out about magnetic poles and plan scientific investigations. The children will observe the forces that magnets produce and present their findings. Switch on Science: Opposites Attract
History	In this topic we will learn all about the prehistoric history of Britain. We will look at sources of evidence that give us information about the time period and consider the discovery of Skara Brae. We will consider the development of tools throughout this time period and the impact this had . We will also place events and artefacts in chronological order.
Geography	In this topic we will learn about how the Iron Age society used land for hill forts and farming. We will explore and understand the significance of these forts. We will investigate one hill fort in detail and produce a reconstruction drawing, or a model of a hill fort.
Design Tech- nology	Not covered this term.
Art and Design	In this topic we will use the cartoon 'The Flintstones' as the basis for our work. Through this work the children will improve their mastery of art and design techniques, including drawing, painting and sculpture with a range of materials (e.g. pencil, charcoal, paint, clay).

	Year 4 (Autumn 1)

Science	This term we will encounter how sounds are made on a variety of instruments. We will explore how sounds are made on a variety of non instruments in order to discover how sounds are created to make music. The children will explore changes in volume, pitch and over distance. Switched on Science Topic: What's that sound
History	In this topic we will learn about the significance of the Roman Empire and look at how far it spanned. We will study the invasion of Britain and begin to understand how the Romans lived. We will visit the museum and art gallery to learn about life in ancient Rome.
Geography	As part of our study of the Roman Empire, we will understand where Rome is in Europe and look at the extent of the Roman Empire using maps and atlases. We will learn about the roads the Romans built for trade links and how they overcame problems in order to distribute water to their towns and cities.
Design Tech- nology	In design technology we will explore a variety of money containers, looking at the different kinds of materials and components used, as well as looking at design and appearance. We will have the chance to practise our sewing skills and expand their experience of working with textiles, as well as designing. (Textiles)
Art and Design	Not covered this term.
PE	In PE this half term we will focus on the skills needed in invasion games. We will use the sport of football to develop our skills.
Computing	In computing this half term we will build upon our previous years work on coding. We will use the program Scratch again but will explore more advanced features.

	The Maya: Year 5 (Autumn 1)		
Literacy	In Literacy this term we will be following the Langauge and Literacy scheme of work. Here we will explore the difference between oral and written staory telling through myths and will wite instructions and recounts. In grammar we will look at paragraphs and how ideas can be linked and will explore relative clauses.		
Numeracy	In Maths we will read, write, order and compare numbers up to 100,0000 and round numbers to the nearest 10,100,1000, 10,000 and 100,000. We will begin to recognise and use Roman numerals to 1000. We will use column addition and subtracts for numbers with up to 4 digits and solve problems using these methods. When solving problems we will use rounding to check our answers.		
Science	In this topic, the children learn about materials and how they change. First they test properties of materials, before looking at how materials dissolve, what a solution is, and evaporation. Finally the children compare reversible and irreversible changes. Switch on Science Unit: Material World		
History	In this topic we will learn all about the ancient South American Mayan civilisation. We will consider what like was like and look at farming, trade and religion. We will begin to understand the significance of chocolate to the Mayans. This will then lead into a local history study of the Cadbury family where we will look at the how this global brand has developed and shaped the local area.		
Geography	As part of this topic we will find out where the Maya lived and understand what the different environmental zones are like, from coast to highlands and lowlands. We will study aspects of human geography and look at the traded goods that Mayan people exchanged, including cocoa beans, the trade routes they used and the terrain they had to cross.		
Design Tech- nology	In design technology this term the children will be making our own food products that incorporate chocolate. (Food)

We will also look at the use of imagery in poetry. In our work with non fiction texts we will explore journalistic writing and read and construct argu-
Numeracy	In Maths this half term we will read, write and compare numbers up to 10 000 000 and will round numbers to a required degree of accuracy. We will use negative numbers in context and solve problems using these. We will also review our formal methods for multiplication and division and use the four number operations to solve problems.
Science	In this topic we will learn about forces and machines. We will start with the force of gravity, then move onto study friction forces, including air and water resistance before finally investigating how simple machines work.
	Switched on Science Topic: Lets get moving. (year 5 topic)
History	In this topic we will build a chronology of the war by placing the events that led to the outbreak on a time- line. We will learn about the precautions that were put in place to keep people safe such as gas masks, blackouts, evacuation and bomb shelters. We will learn about the threat of the German invasion of Britain- how this led to the Battle of Britain and how it was fought. We will find out about Churchill's plans through- out this and place significant events on a timeline.
