Book Fair

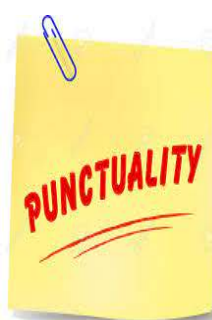
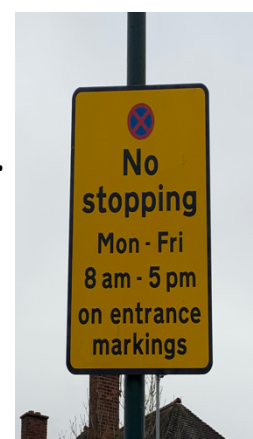
