This summer we will be saying 'Goodbye' to Mrs Savage and Mr Legg. We wish them both well in their next teaching roles. Miss Coltman will be leaving us to teach in Alicante, Spain. We are hoping that the children will be able to use their Spanish skills to communicate with Miss Coltman's new school.

#### **Parents**

This week the government have announced a further relaxation of lockdown restrictions. We are very busy planning for a September return to school. We are planning that all children will return to school fulltime hours with the following restrictions.

- 1) There will be a staggered start to the school day.
- 2) There will be a staggered end to the school day.
- 3) There will be no clubs after school.
- 4) There will be no childcare facility.
- 5) There will be no hot meal provision. Children in EYFS, KS1 will be provided with a packed lunch everyday as part of the universal school meal provision provided by the government.
- 6) Children entitled to Free School Meals will be provided with a packed lunch.
- The next stage of our plan will be to offer hot meals;
- This will be followed by afterschool clubs;
- Following this, we will reopen Wrap Around Care.

Our plan will of course have to be adapted, if the government restrictions change. A comprehensive reopening plan will be sent to you within the next couple of weeks.

Please note that the new Reception classes 2020/21 will begin school on a part time...staggered start.

### **Summer Camp**

During the summer break, the school playground will be resurfaced, security lights will be changed, and the hall floor will be re-laid. This will hinder the amount of holiday provision we can provide.

There will however be a 2-week summer fun camp starting week beginning 17th August. Once further information from the contractors is given, I will be able to let you know if we can offer more provision.
