West Midlands Police have been made aware of a smartphone app called 'UNICO LIVE'. The app is publicised as age restricted 12+ and designed for young people to upload videos of them performing, singing and dancing etc. It has come to our attention that there is inappropriate content on the platform involving young people which is being investigated. The content does not appear to be monitored and we urge you to raise awareness widely to increase vigilance and reduce the likelihood of any child being sexually exploited. Please ensure your children are not accessing the site and share this message with your friends and family.
