Uniform:

We would like to clarify our standard uniform...

Dress Code

- Plain grey skirt/grey or black trousers or a grey pinafore dress
- White shirt, blouse or polo shirt
- Red jumper/cardigan, with school crest
- Polishable, black shoes (no boots or trainers and no logos)
- Plain red/grey/black headscarf (Muslim girls) Scarves covering the face are not permitted.
- Red school book bag
- White, Grey, Black or Red socks/tights - no stripy or patterned tights/ socks with skirts and dresses.

PE Dress Code

On their PE Day children should arrive in school in their full PE kit.

- Plain black shorts (no logos)
- White round neck t-shirt
- Black pumps
- One piece swimming costume (girls), swimming trunks (not knee length shorts) (Boys)

Other things to note:

- Make up is not permitted - this includes nail varnish
- Long hair should be tied back for PE lessons
- Coloured extensions, tramlines and patterned hair are not permitted
